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HOW TO USE THIS WORKBOOK

Our goal for you as a youth leader is for you to have a tool that you can use to build God's principles into your life and into the lives of your young people. When you build anything you must have a good, solid foundation. That is why we titled this book, *Basic Training*. We want you and the young people to have a basic foundation for your faith. Do not be confused, even though we say "Basic", we do not mean simple or really easy. This will be a challenge, but a challenge that is well worth the effort once you see what God has built in and through you. Where do you start? Well, it is one thing to have a tool, but the most important thing is that you have creative ways to use it. Here are some ideas:

One-on-One: You or your youth leaders can use this tool with one other young person. You can meet weekly or at minimum twice a month to review this information. It is best used when you give the information to the young person in sections. Have them complete one lesson within that section per week. This will give you plenty to talk about when you meet with them. It is important that you do this on your own as well. Within the lessons we ask them to tell you things and to report on the weekly missions they accomplish.

Small Group: Another option is to create a small group or cell group meeting to use this material. You can use this along with some times of praying and sharing together to make a complete group meeting. Again, weekly is the ideal time and it is best to give this out in sections to the youth. Ask them to complete one lesson each week. If they get behind, have them catch up! Be ready with your own questions and review of the materials at your meetings. Discuss the content, the key memory verse and the actions they took under the Your Mission section.

Teach With Assignments: You may also use this material as your weekly youth meeting or large group discipleship meeting. You can use the ideas as the main teacher, but add your own insight and cultural illustrations. Then you can use the lessons as home study/devotions for the youth. This will help them become disciples by adding experience to their knowledge. Again here you can add the idea of small groupings within your large group meetings for discussion, feedback and accountability.

Key Verse Bible Memory: In each lesson you will find a key verse within the lesson somewhere. We strongly encourage you to challenge yourself and the youth to memorize the verse each week. We have given you a Key Verse Sheet with all of the verses on it in the back. This can be copied and cut into small cards to use for memorization. The key to memorization is repetition. Many recommend that once you know the verse you review it daily, weekly and monthly so that it sinks into long-term memory. Creatively use this by offering prizes, incentives, etc... for those who have memorized the verse(s).

"We believe that God's word at work in your life will provide you with a strong foundation and will dramatically change your life."

A foundation for life is essential. What is your life founded on? What ultimately determines the decisions you make and the person you are becoming? Is it your friends, parents, teachers, coaches, yourself, another god, or the God of the Bible?

We believe that God's word at work in your life will provide you with a strong foundation and will dramatically change your life. With a strong foundation in place, we want each of you to build a life that is significant; a life that is in touch with God; a life that is purposeful, which will impact those around you. If you faithfully work through this study your foundation for life WILL be strengthened. Read the words written by the Old Testament prophet Jeremiah:

"For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. Then you will call upon me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. I will be found by you," declares the LORD..." Jeremiah 29:11

God promises to provide these three things for you personally. God has plans for YOU; do you see them? He offers hope; have you grabbed a hold of it? He asks that you call out to Him (or talk to Him) and He will be there to listen. Come and seek him with all of your heart and He promises you will find Him.

The *purpose* of this study is primarily for you to get to know the God of the Word, not just the Word of God. We hope that this would be a relationship with God, not a ritual with God. This study is designed to give you a foundation of knowledge and godliness that you would be wise to build your life on. There are three major aspects to this study that you will see in each section; they are *study*, *meditation*, and *action*.

Each time before you sit down to work on a lesson you will be given a choice. You can decide that it is something that you are required to do, like a science project, and you may complete the work, fill in the blanks, and even do the exercises, but in the end there will be no life change. This would be dreadful...a waste of time. The other option is to study each lesson and let the truths sink deeply into your heart. Once truths are imbedded in your heart and mind, they will become a part of who you are and will motivate you to turn the truth into action. The goal is to allow this truth to impact your life in your hands, feet and eyes. Permit this truth to change you from the inside out. The choice is yours!

To help you get the most out of this "Basic Training Bible Study" continually remind yourself of these three steps: *study*, *meditation* and *action*. Can I repeat that so you will remember it, *study*, *meditation* and *action*? Get it? Good! Let us begin.

Study

The knowledge we hope you receive will come from your study of God's word and the notes we give you. But we want to challenge you to go even beyond this study guide into deeper study. Do not be afraid to do some digging in the Bible yourself looking up additional truths on the topics we cover.

While other books, commentaries, and Bible teaching tools are helpful, the Bible must always be the first place you go for knowledge and truth. While the Bible was written roughly between 2,000 and 3,500 years ago, it is still just as useful and relevant as ever...because the principles are timeless. Why? Because they are true! Go ahead and read 2 Timothy 3:16-17 and list what the verses say the Bible will do for you (what is it useful for?)

Regular Bible study is essential. Just as food is essential for you and I to live physically, the Bible is essential for us to live spiritually. Read Matthew 4:4 and Jeremiah 15:16 and write below how the Bible is like food.

Note: If you had a hard time finding various passages, do not sweat it! Make it a personal goal to become more familiar with using your Bible by using the index at the beginning of your Bible to help you to start diligently looking up passages! You will find that in time you will no longer find it necessary to use the index!

"Just as food must be digested in order for us to gain strength from it, the Bible must be digested as well."

Meditation

Just as food must be digested in order for us to gain strength from it, the **Bible must be digested as well**. The digestion process of God's word we call meditation.

Meditation does not mean you have to surround yourself with candles, sit with your legs crossed, and chant "Ohmm..." repeatedly. Meditation is the act of deeply thinking about what you know or have come to know. To meditate on God's word is to absorb it and make it a part of you. Simply put, meditation is making truth your own. (see Psalm 19:14)

Write below what **Joshua 1:7-8** says about God's word; specifically about meditation. When does the passage say we should meditate?

The verse you looked at in Joshua said we should meditate on God's Word day and night (also see Psalm 1:1-2)! There are many ways to meditate. Be creative in this process; If possible, do your study outside, or keep a separate journal of your own thoughts. Write what you learn and your prayers to God (this will also help you not to fall asleep in prayer). You may want to do some of this study with another friend on occasion (but remember it is important that you stay focused). Another idea is to write one truth from your study that day on an index card and quickly review it at

each meal and before you go to bed at night. Find ways to place the truth deeply into your life.

**Note: Memorization can be a great way to help you meditate on a passage. In every lesson you will find a "Key Verse" in the margin. Although it is not required, you may want to consider memorizing these verses! There is also a key verse sheet at the end of the notebook that you can use as a tool.

Action

Without action, study and meditation have not accomplished their purpose. Food needs to be eaten, chewed and placed into action in our blood stream to make us move, make new cells, etc... The food makes a difference only when it is activated, or put into action.

Read James 1:22-25 below and answer the following questions:

"Obey God's message! Don't fool yourselves by just listening to it. If you hear the message and don't obey it, you are like people who stare at themselves in a mirror and forget what they look like as soon as they leave. But you must never stop looking at the perfect law that sets you free. God will bless you in everything you do, if you listen and obey, and don't just hear and forget." James 1:22-25 (CEV)

As you begin this foundational study you will find we will always provide some action steps and some further study ideas. The action steps are requirements but you may choose to do additional further study with the other options listed.

At the end of each lesson there will be a "Mission" for you to complete. (After all, this is a "Basic Training" Bible study.) LESSON 1 GOD IS UNIQUE

Who is God? What is He like? This is a question that man has asked since the beginning of time. To find an answer, people have looked to many different sources like nature, humanity, logical thinking, emotion, and even their own experiences. However, each source can provide different answers, which frequently may contradict one another. As Christians, we have a standard of truth that remains constant and gives us answers to these questions. That truth is the Word of God. We will look today at what God's Word says aboutwell, God. It is critical that you know the truth about God because it is difficult to place your faith in something about which you know little. We need to know about God so that we know what we believe and why we believe it. We also need to know about God so that we are able to recognize false teachings about God, which distort and confuse the truth. Right or wrong, you have some preconceived ideas about what God is like. Try to
put some of that aside and let your study of God's Word teach you directly about who He is.

So, where did God come from? He came from everlasting! And He is going to everlasting! That means that God always was and always will be. Everlasting is not the same as "long-lasting". God is not really, really old. He has no father or mother. He was never born. He just is! He will never die. He has always existed and the only things that have been created in nature are things that He has made. Everything else that we know has had a beginning and an end. You see, we live bound by time and space, but God does not so the terms "beginning and end" do not apply to Him.

Key Verse:

"Do you not know? Have you not heard? The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth."

Isaiah 40:28 (NIV)

The idea of eternity and something being infinite is difficult for us to understand, in fact, it is really a concept that we cannot fully grasp with our finite minds. Yet this does not mean it is not true. For example, people have had difficulty explaining the concept of ice to natives who live in warm climates and have never seen it before. For them the notion that water could become solid was laughable. Ice is simply outside their sphere of knowledge. But this obviously does not mean ice does not exist. Similarly, the idea of eternity is outside our sphere of knowledge.

Dook up the word "everlasting" in a dictionary or thesaurus and write some synonyms (words that mean the same thing) of this word.

Read Exodus 3:14. How does God describe Himself to Moses? How does this description, or name, show His eternality?

Which makes more sense...to say that some cosmic sub-atomic particle (i.e. matter) has always existed or that something (or Someone) transcendent of time (outside of time, not bound by time), space, and matter has always existed?

How can matter, which is bound by time and space, also be unbound by time and space? The bottom line is that in order for anything to exist today, something has to have always existed. Both views take faith to believe as truth.

**If you are interested in learning more on topics like "Does God exist?", "Is Jesus really God's Son?", and "Is the Bible true?", please mention this to Joel and we

will look into creating a section specifically geared to tackle these kinds of questions.

"Unique" means different from all others; Having no like or equal; One of a kind. Before you continue, can you think of some things that make the God of the Bible different from gods of other religions? How is He unique?

Read each of the following Scriptures. Note what each has to say about how God is unique. You may want to underline, highlight, or list the verses in the back of your Bible so that you are always ready to answer anyone who makes false claims about God.

- Numbers 23:19
- Deuteronomy 6:4-5
- Isaiah 43:10
- Isaiah 44:6
- Isaiah 44:8

Isn't it comforting to know that we worship a God who is not just like human beings? He did not start as a man and ascend to godhood, nor does He have humanly limitations or failures. He is above all of creation, all of time, all sin, and all imperfection. He is the Creator...we are the created. Praise, adoration, and worship is what God desires from us.

He alone is worthy of our praise. We don not worship Him because we have to, but because God deserves it! We are to love Him with all of our heart, with all our soul, and with all our strength. He is the only true God, and beside Him there are no others. He has no worthy competition. Yet, each of us has things in our life that we place, at times, above Him in our priorities.

What are some "gods" in your life that steal your time and affection away from the one true and everlasting God?

How do you think these things make God feel?

Read Exodus 20:3-4. What is the first of the Ten Commandments that God gives to Moses? Why do you think the Lord starts with this one?

§ YOUR MISSION:

God is unique, as the creator of the world, He is eternal, He is spirit, and there has never been and never will be another god like Him. We have also seen that He is jealous for you. He wants your love and your worship. Would you give it to Him now? Maybe you have allowed yourself to "worship" other things of this world. Go to Him now and praise His wonderful name.

This evening (or the next clear night) go outside (preferably away from city & street lights) find a place where you can look up at the stars. How many were you able to count? God created those, and billions upon billions more. What thoughts ran through your mind as you counted the stars?

Now open your Bible to Isaiah 40. Read verses 25-31 aloud to God as if you had written them.

P Below, write a meaningful prayer to Him. Confess your distracted heart (see Heb. 12:2a) and tell Him that you desire to worship Him alone.
